The Generosity of Carmine's Import Service Led to New Programs

On March 18, 2020, Carmine Cupani with Carmine's Import Service reached out to Chris Comer (CEO, Kernersville Chamber of Commerce) expressing the desire to assist older adults at the start of the COVID pandemic. His message "We want to offer complimentary senior citizen medication and grocery pickup and delivery in our area. Can you help get this out?" was forwarded to Lisa Miller, our Senior Center Director. Lisa connected Carmine with our Volunteer Services Manager and our Personal Shopper service began. Through the pandemic, we were able to utilize Carmine's team to get groceries and pharmacy orders fulfilled for those in need. Soon after, two local churches. The Summit and Mercy's Well volunteers learned about the service and began assisting as well. The service has continued to grow and expand since March 2020 and has evolved into what we now call Personal Shopper.

From this service, we also saw a growing need for community connection and engagement for these service recipients. This special group of aging or disabled adults, who are home-bound, are often without close family or community ties and are often isolated and forgotten. The Personal Shopper and Visitation volunteers began to recognize a growing need for community connection with these individuals. Along with our Volunteer Services Manager, they began to develop other ways to reach and bless these special recipients, and The **Blessing Project** was born.

The Blessing Project volunteers procure, arrange, and deliver seasonal meals, gifts, goody bags, and other necessities to our homebound service recipients. This includes Holiday Angel Tree in December, home delivered meals at Thanksgiving and Valentine's Day, a Blessing Box household items in the summer, and a Spring Gift Basket at Easter.

Mr. Cupani's generosity and community spirit led to so much more than he may have imagined. Since March 18, 2020, we have served 102 different individuals with nearly 1,000 errand fulfillments (primary grocery and pharmacy pickups) and served 120 individuals with 342 Blessing Project deliveries.

AARP Tax Volunteers are Needed for 2024 Tax Season

AARP Foundation Tax-Aide provides in-person and virtual tax assistance to anyone, free of charge, with a focus on taxpayers who are over 50 and have low to moderate income. This past tax season, we helped over 800 people in the Kernersville area, with those getting refunds averaging just over \$1,250. We are looking for more volunteers to help us serve more people in the community.

We need volunteers to serve as Client Facilitators (Intake). Volunteer at least four hours per week during tax season.

Client Facilitators help older taxpayers feel welcome and at ease by greeting them, gathering and organizing their paperwork, and describing the tax prep process. They help ease the stress of tax season for low to moderate income people who are age 50+. Experience is not necessary; we will provide training and IRS certification. Requirements: detail-oriented, desire to help others and must attend training in December (on-line) and January (one half-day face to face).

Transportation: Provide rides to and from medical appointments.

Handy Person: Provide assistance with minor home repairs inside or outside the home.

Pastoral Counseling: Counseling sessions offered by appointment only with a certified volunteer counselor.

Medicare & Financial Care Counseling: In partnership with other organizations, provide financial & insurance support via phone and in-person appointments with a Financial or Certified SHIIP Counselor.

Caregiver Support Group: Monthly meetings held for caregivers needing support.

Advocacy: Provide meetings and events to raise awareness of elder abuse, neglect, and exploitation in conjunction with local law enforcement.

Legal Aide Consulting: In partnership with Legal Aid of NC, provide legal support with civil matters involving basic human needs such as safety, shelter, income, and more via phone and in-person appointments.

Senior Enrichment Programs: A full-time "Center of Excellence" offering a variety of life enriching activities and classes in: arts, education and enrichment, fun and games, and health and wellness.

Bill Radisch Computer Center for Seniors: Offer one on one computer and other electronic device operational education and assistance.

Equipment Loan Program: Loan out durable medical equipment such as canes, walkers, and wheelchairs for short-term or long-term needs on a renewable basis.
